

I am a Hudson Valley Parent

Eric Martin: Dad, Doctor, Ironman

rthopedic surgeon Eric
Martin M.D. of Goshen,
father of 15 year old Zach
and 13 year old Jason, had one of
those moments many parents in
their forties have. He took a look at
photos from a family vacation, and
could barely recognize himself.

"I took one look at myself and didn't see the me I remembered being," he recalls. "I started running and set goals for myself. That was five years ago."

At age 48, Dr. Martin, now an Ironman athlete, competes in marathons and other races, bikes and swims. He's involved his whole family in his pursuit of a healthier lifestyle, which includes twicea-week personal trainer strength sessions with his two sons.

Generations of athletes

Eric Martin grew up in Albany, with a brother and twin sister. His father, an ophthalmologist just now winding down his own practice, is an avid golfer who always took his kids to walk all 18 holes on the course with him, and also ran marathons. He passed on his love of exercise and athleticism to his kids, just as Martin passes on that knowledge to yet another generation.

When not training, the doctor loves planning vacations around the world with his family. Past trips have included particularly memorable time outdoors in Iceland, among their annual outings. They're all avid hikers, intent on also getting to all the

Hudson Valley's trails, and skiers with a love for the region's mountains.

"I've always been a goals person. At first my brother, who's a very accomplished tri-athlete, helped me a great deal," he adds. "But then it made sense to get the whole family involved. Otherwise there's just not enough time for everything."

"Outside the Ironman season, I drop the training back a bit in favor of quality, higher intensity sessions," Dr. Martin adds. "I like to get my training in early each morning, and that involves things I can do at home, including running and biking, as well as family visits to a nearby pool several times a week."

A change in rhythm

It was no coincidence that Dr. Martin's push to get himself back in shape, and then reach further as a tri-athlete, occurred when his boys were moving from their elementary towards middle school years. The combination of their needing less direct attention, and involvement in after-school activities, helped open up their father's schedule, as well as that of their mother, Claudia, a full time attorney.

"You temper what you do; it's very good to figure out a rhythm," Dr. Martin says of how he balances the parenting, work and physical training aspects of his life. "We make sure to have dinner together almost every night; Claudia is a great cook, and is excellent at emphasizing the healthiness of what we eat while also making everything delicious."

Challenges still arise when the doctor's regular schedule of office hours and surgery gets "add-ons" and emergencies, or the kids' schedules change. More than anything, Dr. Martin finds that the sorts of breaks others like from stressful schedules -- a snow day, a bout with the flu or a bad head cold -- break what he likes most in his life: a smoothly-running schedule that's busy and full.

Like father, like sons

As for how this all works with Zach and Jason's parenting, the doctor speaks about maintaining an "aggressive" focus on academics, just like he had growing up, a strong emphasis on maintained exercise regimes and the stressing of solid goal achievement in one's life.

"I'm a big believer in activities that are easy to maintain throughout a lifetime," the doctor adds. "I also believe in setting a good example; I'm an achiever. I believe in picking a goal and then breaking down what you need to do about getting there. That's the biggest lesson I've been teaching my boys."

What does Dr. Martin learn, in turn, from his sons, Zach and Jason?

"They're happy-go-lucky and goofy but always ready to learn," he answers. "We find it's a joy just being around each other."

"Mom, when should I go to the gynecologist?"

Moms and doctors discuss a girl's first OB-GYN appointment

ince your daughter was born, the pediatrician has been able to answer all of your medical questions about her. Now, as your daughter matures and reaches puberty, you both may be wondering: when is the right time to see the gynecologist?

Many mothers feel in the dark regarding when and how to go about this process without causing stress and anxiety for their daughter (and themselves).

How old is old enough

"When is the right age?" asks Poughkeepsie mom, Rachel Daley, voicing the same concern as most mom's with teenage daughters.

"There's not one answer to that question," states Dr. Robin Karpfen, MD, FACOG, head of the Obstetrics and Gynecology division at Crystal Run Healthcare.

Girls should visit a gynecologist for the first time between the ages of 13-15, according to The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists,. However, this age bracket does not fit in all cases and is considered more of a guideline for parents rather than a requirement.

"Every exam is tailored to each young woman," says Dr. Karpfen. This includes the age in which they feel ready for the visit. Factors that



may jump-start the scheduling of a gynecology appointment could be the beginning of menstruation, interest in learning more about reproductive health, or experiencing menstrual concerns. But the tell-tale sign that your daughter is ready to see an OB-GYN will most likely come directly from her, whether outright state stated or by showing increased interest in the topic.

For moms looking for a way to begin an open forum with their daughters, Dr. Karpfen suggests bringing up the topic of reproductive health at your daughter's pediatricians appointment around the time she begins puberty. Starting this conversation with your daughter and a health professional she's familiar with can be useful for both moms and daughters to figure out when the time is right.

If you're still unsure about your daughter's readiness, Dr. Karpfen says, "Sixteen is good, without any pressing issues earlier."

What to expect

"A lot of the appointment is going to be discussion," explains Dr. Karpfen when describing a typical first gynecology appointment. "A lot of information, opinions and questions."

When a young woman arrives at the OB-GYN for her first visit, she will most likely feel some anxiety. Knowing this, Dr. Karpfen encourages starting off the appointment with information and conversation.

A variety of topics will be addressed at your daughter's appointment to spark any primary questions or concerns. Dr. Karpfen acknowledges that subject matter will vary from reproductive health and contraceptives, to even social media and peer pressure.

Physical exams will vary depending on the purpose of your daughter's visit. "Breast exams are expected". says Dr. Karpfen. Educating women on self-breast exams is critical to teach at a young age and opens up an opportunity for your daughter to begin asking more in-depth questions about her body.

Pelvic exams, however, are not to be expected on the first visit if your daughter expresses no immediate concerns.

"The appointment is not about invading," encourages Dr. Karpfen, "It's about starting a conversation."

Preparation is key

Preparing for your daughter's first appointment days before arriving at the office may significantly ease feelings of anxiety and stress.

For professional resources to reference, Dr. Karpfen recommends exploring the American College of Obstetrics and Gynecology website for patient information. This section has several online pamphlets available on a variety of different topics specific to teens.

If you're unsure about what resources to review, your physicians will be more than willing to provide pamphlets they have available on subjects your daughter may find helpful for preparation. "We have a ton of information available in the office for patients," states Dr. Karpfen, referring to the Middletown and Goshen locations.

"I think it's best to share as much information as possible beforehand," says Rosendale mom, Tina Long, when looking back on her daughter's first appointment. Sharing personal stories with your daughter of your OB-GYN experiences can also help reduce anxiety says Long, finding her daughter very receptive to this strategy.

Respect privacy

So, the time is here, the appointment was scheduled, you're sitting in the waiting room, and the nurse calls your daughter's name. The next question arises- do you go in with her?

For some mothers who have a tight bond with their daughters, the question may not seem like a question at all. However, Long and her daughter, Megan (now 28) are in agreement that you should respect your daughter's privacy by asking beforehand.

"We have always had a very close and open relationship so I figured she would want me there," states Long. "But that was not for me to decide." As significant as this appointment is for you as a mom, this benchmark can be equally as important for your daughter on her journey into womanhood.

"Make sure you give your daughter the choice to have you in the room," says Megan. It is scary, and she may want you there, but you want her to have the best care, so she needs to be able to be totally honest with her doctor."

From a physician's perspective, Dr. Karpfen reports preferring to have the moms present during the first portion of the exam to provide details about the family history and surgical health.

However, after this, Dr. Karpfen

admits she will ask the mothers to leave to talk privately with their daughter.

"It affords a young patient the opportunity to say and ask questions they didn't even know they felt uncomfortable asking about in front of parents," encourages Dr. Karpfen. If the moms feel left out, Karpfen leaves an option to regroup later in the appointment.

Include your daughter in the process

When choosing an OB-GYN for your daughter, it may not initially occur to moms to include their daughters in the decision making process. Megan states that skipping this step can be a huge mistake.

"It's important for moms not to assume that their daughters will feel comfortable going to their choice of doctors," says Megan regarding her first appointment. "My mom's doctor was a male and as a teen that freaked me out."

Your daughter will appreciate the gesture of being involved when choosing a physician. If she is comfortable from the beginning, chances are better for positive ongoing care.

Physicians and parents alike agree- talking to your daughter is the best start to scheduling and preparing for her first gynecology appointment.

By keeping communication open, respecting your daughter's privacy and always providing emotional support, Long reassures moms, "You will know when it is time."

So, you're having a baby... now what?

Learn about the choices from moms who have been there

uzanne Schmidt Bloise has a friend in Seattle who delivered her baby at a birthing center four years ago. "That was the first time I had ever heard of not using a hospital," says the Monroe mom who gave birth to her daughter, Charlotte May, 18 months ago.

"My husband and I went on a tour and I knew instantly that's what I wanted," says Bloise. "It had offices downstairs and basically an apartment upstairs: kitchen, living room, bedrooms and bathrooms set up for birthing."

Her pregnancy was normal until the last eight weeks when they sent her for a sonogram and noticed that her daughter's belly wasn't growing at the same rate as the rest of her body. Bloise was admitted to the hospital and induced while a midwife worked with the doctors. "It was the best possible care I could have had without delivering in the birthing center," she says.

Bloise realized that she had birthing options and made the decisions that were right for her.

The options have evolved

"Obstetric care has evolved greatly over the last 10 years and for the better," says Marcel Hinds, an obstetrician and gynecologist with Health Quest Medical Practice. "The paternalistic approach to childbirth, which has led to a lot of patient

mistrust, has become extinct. The care of a woman and her baby is less medically oriented, more flexible and focuses more on patient experience."

Essentially, expectant mothers still have the same birthing options they had a decade or two ago -- a cesarean section, natural birth, home birth and water birth, but according to Kate Desa, director of maternity services at the New Garden Birth Center at Northern Dutchess Hospital in Rhinebeck, the handling of these options is what has changed.

Know your choices

"We make every attempt to make the cesarean birth as much like a vaginal delivery as possible," says Desa.

The New Garden Birth Center has a family-centered cesarean center.
"We use a drape that allows parents to see the baby being born," says Desa. "The baby also goes skin to skin with mom after delivery, in order to allow that bonding time and make breastfeeding easier and to try to take away some of that very clinical feel of a cesarean section."

The lights are dimmed and the room is warmed. "We really don't separate mom and baby during cesarean any longer," she says. "The baby stays in there with a dedicated nurse to help her and mom during the procedure, and then they both go back to the room together."

For a vaginal delivery, Desa says now the entire family is encouraged to have that time together too. "We

highly encourage skin to skin contact right after delivery, breast feeding as soon as possible after delivery and delaying any medications for as long as we are allowed to, or as long as we can, to allow that time for mom and baby to be together," says Desa. "We keep that sacred first hour to encourage the family to bond and to really adjust to having this new baby in their life."

Jennyfer Cruz-Bernave wanted a water birth, but it wasn't available at the time she was in labor, so she chose a natural birth at the hospital instead. "I wanted to be an active participant throughout labor and have minimal routine intervention," she says. "For my first daughter, I felt a strong feeling of empowerment during labor, and after

labor I felt so accomplished. I felt like super mom."

Kahla Johnson Skonber always wanted an at home water birth too. "My labor and delivery was very calm and quiet and they let me do what my body told me, instead of them telling me what to do," says Skonber.

Decide on a plan with your doctor

Deciding on what birthing option is best starts with a conversation between the mom and her obstetrician. "We keep an open conversation with our mothers as to how they want their birth to go," says Desa. "I highly encourage mothers to take a childbirth class or do some reading or talk with their OB as to what options they would like to have. It's good if moms come with an idea but also with an open mind."

Some medical reasons may dictate what choices you have. "If you decide that you had wanted an epidural, you can't use the birthing tub," says Desa. "If

the baby has passed a bowel movement while it was inside, you wouldn't deliver in the tub either. If there are any signs that the baby is in distress, you wouldn't be in the tub, because we couldn't make sure that the baby stays safe."

Christine Vinson was hospitalized for severe morning sickness. "I was in labor for nearly 30 hours. My doctor was great and encouraged me to keep going. But, eventually I begged for a C-section and it was done. Because I was so sick and my son was small, I didn't hold him for a few hours and spent the entire day out of it. But overall recovery was easy."

Research and create the right space

A mom can also design her perfect environment. Desa says, "Some people will bring music, clothes that they're comfortable in and massage or scented oils that they use during labor. Whatever it is that breaks that stress, anxiety and pain cycle."



Hinds explains that each woman has her own personal vision for her delivery experience, shaped by many factors. "After accounting for those factors, she should choose a venue that best suits her personal and medical needs. Women should also diligently research."

Desa cautions moms about researching on the internet. "There are some good resources out there for childbirth and childbirth options, but there's also some misinformation," she says. "If you come across anything that you are concerned about, speak to your provider. I think that people do risk sometimes being misinformed."

Know that plans can change

Kimberlee Ann Donahue had her first son in a traditional hospital setting with an epidural. "I was about 10 seconds away from a C-section and a very skilled physician used forceps and got him out, but he ended up in the NICU for four days and that was heartbreaking."

When she found out she was pregnant again, she did more research on natural childbirth. "I desired a home birth because I felt my body was designed to have a baby, and I didn't want to be pressured with the epidural.

Even a well thought out birth plan can go awry. Jessica Carola had a birth plan in place, but ended up with a C-section. "I dilated two centimeters, my water broke at home a week later and dilated to 10 centimeters within a couple hours," she says. "Then I pushed for 2 1/2 hours and nothing. They rushed to do a C-section and when I asked for other options they said there was none."

When Helen Hoffman gave birth to her oldest child, she had a plan but says that the hospital didn't listen to it. "I had signs on my door, and told every nurse there that I did not want narcotic drugs and not to offer them," says the Phoenicia resident. "After

being in mild labor for six hours the hospital decided I was taking too long and they wanted to give me Pitocin to speed things up. I declined. There was no medical indication that Pitocin was needed."

Hoffman felt bullied into using Pitocin. "My progress halted, because I couldn't stop crying from feeling my control over my birth being stripped away from me," says Hoffman. "I called for a new nurse who let me get up and move and labor in water which was amazing."

"Choice matters," says Hinds. "Women today have more choices about where, when and how they will deliver their babies."
